Before departing for home they proceeded to show Hans on this first trip to the U. S., a bit of the country. A few days were spent on tours of New York City and the World's Fair. Later in the year the family plan to take Hans

on trips to Niagara Falls and Washington, D. C. Hans finds everything here is much more plentiful than he had ever imagined. State Approves Teacher Tenure

Statewide teacher tenure went into effect for 1,414 school districts and 78,000 teachers in Michigan last Friday. Last year at this time only 60 systems had tenure provisions for their teachers.

Basically, tenure is a means of providing continuity in the school programs of Michigan children and a measure of job stability for those teachers who have shown themselves to be competent as well as properly certificated.

Under tenure, once a teacher successfully completes a probationary period of two years he may be freed from the necessity of reapplying for the position year after year.

The new tenure act does not forbid the firing of a teacher. However, it does require that a teacher be given a written notice of the reasons for his dismissal as well as providing for hearing procedures and other protections against arbitrary dismissal.

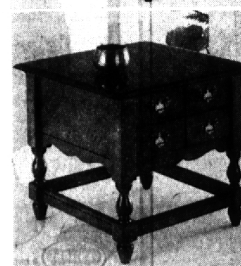
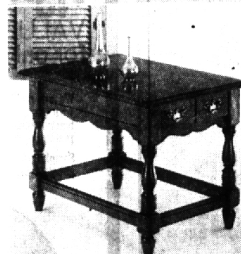

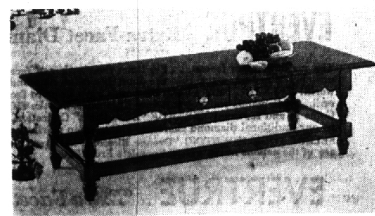
