

Community House Expands Program for Fall Semester

The Community House (Bates and Townsend, Birmingham) has once again extended its educational activities program for the 1964 fall season.

New teachers, as well as new subjects, will enrich the curriculum. Virginia Schaefer, whose presentation and discussions of art have made her one of the most popular instructors at the Community House will be offering a new class, "Introduction to Art Appreciation," which includes slides and reproductions, with Mrs. Schaefer's lectures.

The course is being offered in the evening to encourage the attendance of couples, a spokesman said.

A DEMAND FOR more Community House courses in flower arranging has led Mrs. Frances Calhoun to add a "Dry Arrangement Work Shop" to her diversified classes.

Language courses have been a long-time favorite at The Community House, and the addition of German and Italian this year will widen their appeal.

Irma Majnari joins the staff this year. A native of Yugoslavia, she is a master of five languages. Mrs. Majnari will emphasize reading and conversational skills.

FOR CRAFT-MINDED students who want to apply their interest to both useful and decorative items, mosaic tiling is available for the first time this fall.

Gloria Robak, an addition to The Community House staff, will instruct this new course.

Artistic ability is not a prerequisite, and students will create items such as table tops, jewelry, bowls, wall hangings and ashtrays.

New teachers in already existing courses are Mrs. Mary Louise Angeli and Mrs. Rose Marie Gregor. Mrs. Angeli, who will teach French, came to the United States from Paris seven years ago. She has spent four years teaching in the Birmingham School system and two years as a Berlitz instructor.

Mrs. Angeli will include visual aids in her class and offer extensive student participation.

WITH 20 YEARS of experience in teaching ballet, Rose Marie Gregor uses the graded system of the Cecchetti method. She also is experienced in the Russian and French methods.

Besides ballet, Mrs. Gregor will instruct a modern jazz dance class in which some aspects of ballet and modern dance will be included.

Registration for these and all other classes at The Community House will begin at 9 a.m. Sept. 8. Classes are planned to be small to insure individual attention; early registration is advised.

Enameling, Exercise (for women), First Aid, Flower Arrangement, Dry Arrangement Workshop, Christmas Craft Workshop, French, Pottery, Home Accessories Workshop, German, Interior Decoration, Italian, Millinery, Mosaic Tiling, Painting (adult), Painting (youth), Russian (advanced), Seamanship and Safe Boat Handling, Sewing and Tailoring, Silversmithing, and Study Skills Workshop. Also, cosponsored with Oakland University, Problems of Literary Censorship and Music Appreciation.

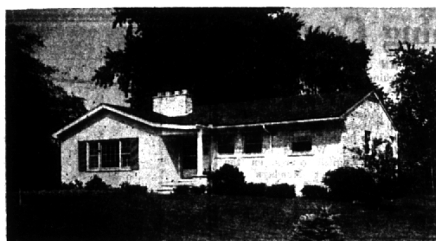

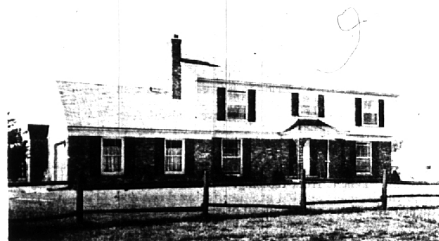

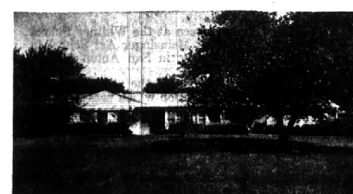
