## Traffic Toll Keeps Rising In Michigan

Michigan's 1964 traffic toll will hit a record all-time high of more than 2,900 deaths if the present rate of increase in the first eight months persists through the remainder of the year, according to reports which will raise the provisional total and record the month as another with an increase.

August traffic accidents added 176 deaths, one less than 176 in the same month in 1963. But delayed reports will raise the provisional total and record the month as another with an increase.

MORE COMPLETE figures for July show 426 killed and 12,243 injured in 21,670 accidents. These were increases of 38, or 20 per cent in deaths; 1,867, or 18 per cent in injured; and 1,067, or 16 per cent in accidents over the same month last year.

The July toll, highest since Oct. 1943, again by a wide margin, was the fifth worst month on record. The high was 235 in Dec., 1959.

Accumulated figures for the first eight months show 1,579 killed and 55,581 injured in 151,727 accidents, respective increases of 21, 15 and 8 per cent over the same period last year.

Estimated mileage for the first six months, the latest information available, totaled 18.2 billion, a rise of .5 per cent compared with the corresponding period last year, while the death rate per 100 million vehicle miles was up 11 per cent to 5.1.

The class material will follow the same pattern currently being used by the Oakland County Department of Health and will be without charge. Each series will consist of five lessons taught by Mrs. Florence Meiers, M.S., A.D.A., executive dietitian, and John Collins, registered nurse.

THE CLASSES will be from 7 to 9 p.m. on the following Tuesdays—Sept. 22, 29, Oct. 6, 13 and 20.

The classes will stress the importance of the diabetic's cooperation with his physician and the responsibility of the patient in caring for himself, in order to lead a healthful and useful life. Diabetics must learn to recognize the signs of their physicians to attend these classes.
