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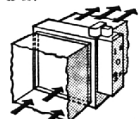
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Fall Schedule Begins at Church Of the Master

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New Test Reported For Cancer Drugs

Two Michigan State University botanists have reported a new, simpler method of testing the some 50,000 chemicals annually produced as possible cancer drugs.

Their method, while not the sole means of testing a tumor inhibitor, is faster than the job of testing chemicals on mice. In accuracy, it also closely matches the mice test that their method involves using birding, they reported.
