Will-O-Way Estate Sold To Developer

The historic Will-O-Way estate located at West Long Lake Road east of Telegraph Road, has been sold by the Merrill family for development as a residential community to be known as Will-O-Way Estates.

The announcement was made by G. Gordon Walker, executive vice president of the Howard T. Keating Co., realtors for the new subdivision.

Wembleton Development Co. is the purchaser of the thirty-four acres of land, which will provide one-half acre homesites of natural beauty, reports Philip Kaplan, president of the developing concern.

HOMES OF architectural distinction, priced from \$40,000, will be approved by an architectural committee to maintain the community's standards. Ravine sites, wooded sites, hill-top acreage and land overlooking a storybook lake in a setting of weeping willows will provide a community of rustic charm and natural beauty.

Road construction is now under way and will be completed within the month. All city conveniences will be provided in the new Will-O-Way Estates.

Entrance to the subdivision will be from West Long Lake Road, adjacent to the property retained by Gela and Kenneth Turner, Jr., which includes their home and the Will-O-Way Apprentice Theater and School.

Turner said that the school and apprentice theater will be in operation as usual.

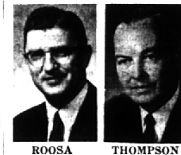

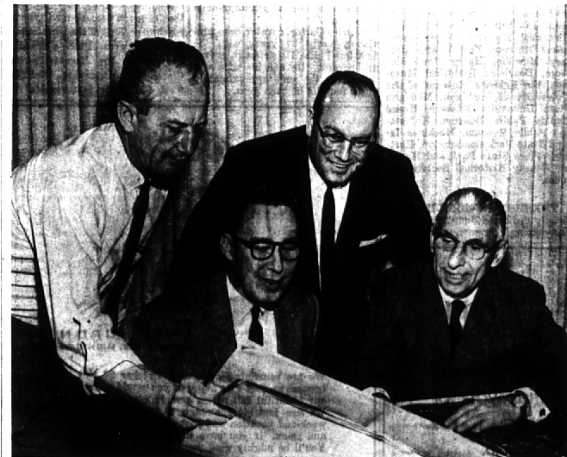
