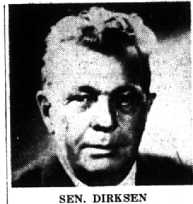

## Sen. Dirksen To Speak to Publishers

Highlight of the fall national conference of the Suburban Press Foundation, Sept. 24-25, Chicago, will be a luncheon speech by Sen. Everett M. Dirksen, Senate Minority leader and figure in the recent civil rights legislation.

His topic will be, "The Civil Rights Law Examined for the Suburban Press."

Chester K. Hayes, foundation executive director, in making the announcement from the association's national offices in Chicago, commented: "No legislation in recent years has been surrounded by so many rumors, misstatements of facts and misconceptions as has the Civil Rights Bill. Because this is a national issue which is also very much a matter of local interest, Suburban Press member publishers and editors of suburban papers need to have exact data on the civil rights law as it applies to their readership."

"The Foundation feels privileged to present at its conference Sen. Dirksen who, perhaps more than any other Senate member, was responsible for the law's final form."

THE NATIONAL Suburban Press Conference will be devoted entirely to editorial subjects. Workshop sessions will be moderated by William L. Dulany, journalist, instructor, Pennsylvania State University and former suburban newspaper editor.

Paul Neal Averil, Foundation president and publisher of the Birmingham (Michigan) Eccentric, is chairman of the two-day conference. Attending will be Henry M. Hogan, Jr., associate publisher, and Kenneth R. Weaver, managing editor.

Also attending the National Suburban Press Foundation Conference will be Foundation member publishers and editorial staffs from coast to coast, invited non-member publishers, and deans and professors of journalism schools.

school traffic safety education, 78 per cent.

Birmingham received substantial reports in its death and injury records performance, 8 per cent, and organization for traffic safety improvement, 9 per cent.

Oman did suggest Birmingham might undertake the organization of a traffic safety improvement program.

"THE CITY should establish a coordinating committee of business and civic leaders and officials concerned with traffic problems," he said.

"Throughout the country, citizen groups are contributing in various ways and in varying degrees to the cause of traffic safety."

Such an organization, he said, would provide Birmingham with a group that would best be able to inform the public, to help develop positive attitudes and provide support for sound official traffic safety measures.

School and a multiple-housing development in the area.

"When I-75 is completed we are hopeful that the traffic on Opdyke will drop by half," Case said.

ON QUARTON where the speed is 40 mph, children have to walk on a narrow strip between the blacktop and a ditch. This situation has brought several complaints from mothers whose children attend Conant School, the supervisor said.

Both Conant and Bloomfield Hills Junior High School are located on Quarton between Telegraph and Franklin.

Trustee Frank Swindell suggested that similar action be taken in front of other schools where the speed limit seems too high.

## Gov. Appoints Lawyer to Board

Birmingham lawyer, Arthur T. Iverson, Jr., 2792 Dorchester, has been appointed by Gov. Romney to the Workmen's Compensation Appeal Board, a term which expires Feb. 1, 1968.

NAMED WITH Iverson was Paul Mahinske of Detroit. The appeal board, now consisting of three members, was increased to five by the 1964 legislature.

Board members receive an annual salary of \$13,500. Iverson is the son of a Constitutional Convention delegate and Mahinske served as a Democratic delegate to the convention. The appointments require state Senate confirmation.
