and candlelight is used. Beds are simple and clean but no heat is supplied.

In my case I slept in my mountain climbing clothes. Since this day was perfect for climbing, a total of 100 climbers were on hand and many slept in corridors on the floor. The food is brought up daily by two mules.

DINNER IS SERVED with a big bowl of hot soup at about 6:30 p.m. At 8 p.m. sharp everyone is off to sleep and awakened the following day at 4 a.m. In matter of seconds, the lot of climbers is up and you can sense the anxiety and eagerness of the climbers to conquer the 14,702-foot Matterhorn.

Breakfast is a continental type and some food is taken for the climb. At approximately 5:15 a.m. everyone heads for the first ridge which is one of the more dangerous ones, especially when it's icy. This morning, it was icy. Every climber should have a guide but many come without money or in some cases, only enough money for the guide but not enough for food.

THE EYES of the climbers tell you that they would sacrifice their lives just so they could climb the Matterhorn. This is gentle evidence as you see them squirm for the top with a guide or without, and in some cases, no experience, just plain courage.

In my case, I had a guide, but what category of reason applied to me (wanting to climb the Matterhorn) is a question mark for myself.
