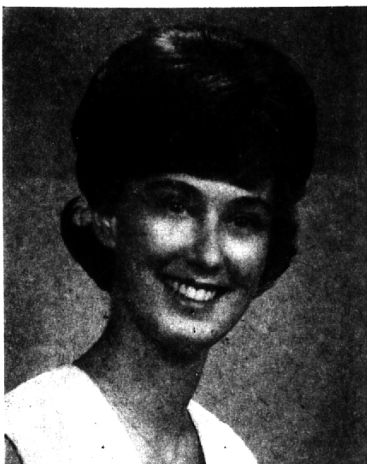


## Autumn Calendar Starred By Romantic Tidings
