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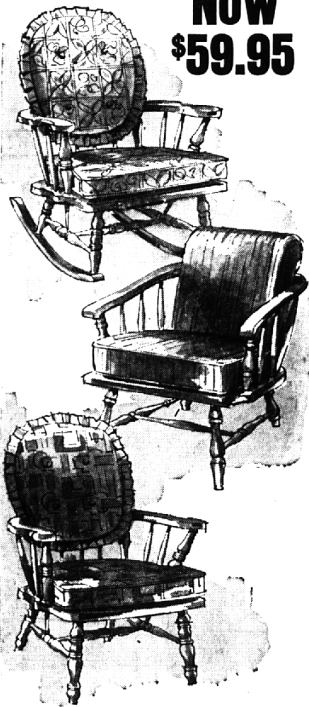
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COLLEGE NEWS

Specialist Griffin, a member of the command's 14th Signal Detachment, entered the Army in January 1962 and was last assigned at Fort Gordon, Ga.

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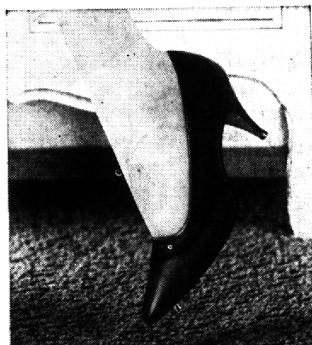
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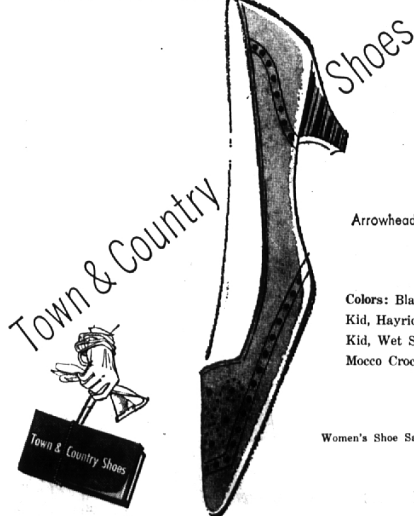


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
