State Hospital Requires Help From Gray Ladies

"Just about every department is asking for more Gray Ladies," states Mrs. Wayne Smith, Gray Lady coordinator at the 3,000 bed Pontiac State Hospital.

THE PONTIAC State Hospital services Oakland, Genesee, Macomb, Lapeer, St. Clair, Sanilac, Huron, Shiawassee, Livingston and Tuscola counties.

In order to fill the many requests for Gray Ladies, the Pontiac State Hospital, in conjunction with the Oakland County Chapter of the American Red Cross, is conducting a four-week training program beginning Oct. 1 and ending Oct. 29.

The Oct. 1 session will take place at the Red Cross Headquarters, 118 Franklin Blvd., in Pontiac, from 1:30-3:30 p.m., and will cover an orientation of the Red Cross services, rules and regulations.

THE REMAINDER of the classes are scheduled in the staff auditorium of the Pontiac State Hospital each Tuesday and Thursday between the hours of 9:30 and 11:30 a.m.

Staff personnel will discuss psychology of volunteering, mental illness, ethical code for volunteers, departmental orientation and volunteer duties. Several tours of facilities are involved in the training program.

The final meeting on Oct. 29 is devoted to hospital assignments and a refreshment hour with hospital faculty and Red Cross administrators.

GRAY LADY openings exist in many areas of the hospital, such as, information desk, dental office, pharmacy, occupational and recreational therapy departments, nursing, and office cart.

Treatment units that offer a challenge and satisfaction to the volunteer include those of geriatrics, day hospital, alcoholism, outpatient, children, and the newest department of intensive treatment.

Donald Miller, executive director of the Oakland County American Red Cross Chapter, advised that interviewing of Gray Lady applicants will begin next Monday through Friday at the Chapter House.

Applications for prospective candidates are available at the American Red Cross or by contacting Ted A. Panaretos, Community Relations Director at the Pontiac State Hospital.

Fireman Cited For Heroics

Bloomfield Township fireman Dan Miller has been commended by the township board for rescuing a 43-year-old woman from her burning house on Sept. 5.

Miller, "in disregard of his own safety," entered the house at 4200 Orchard Way, found Mrs. Weyman Smith unconscious from smoke inhalation and carried her to safety.

Mrs. Smith was revived with the fire department's resuscitator and taken to William Beaumont Hospital, Royal Oak, for treatment.

Miller's commendation was for "his resolute and courageous action" in the rescue. A copy of the resolution will be placed in the fireman's service record.
