Tag Day Friday Benefits Disturbed Young Children

A Tag Day was held in Birmingham on Friday to help the visually handicapped get a better start in life.
Penrickton Nursery, 26580 Eureka Rd. in Taylor has been providing a program for visually handicapped children in the greater metropolitan area for more than a decade.

THE NURSERY has recently been expanded to include blind children.

With emotional disturbances, mental retardation and other learning problems.
The ultimate purpose of the program is to provide a total approach for visually handicapped children with learning problems whose needs cannot be adequately met by the facilities or plans existing in their homes or communities.

PENRICKTON Nursery provides an interim program for these children so they may have the opportunity to develop mentally, physically, socially and emotionally. Five types of service programs are available to serve the needs of the parents and the child from infancy through 10 years of age.
The professional staff includes the director, Donald Cardinal, M.A. in Special Education; Barbara Ruby, M.A. in Speech Therapy; Neal Freeling, M.A. in Clinical Psychology, and eight child care workers.

PENRICKTON does not receive any government aid or community funds, and depends entirely upon private donations, approved officially by the Internal Revenue Service as tax deductible.

Interested persons, clubs, and organizations such as the Metropolitan Clubs, Birmingham Business Women and the South Oakland County Medical Assistants have contributed the greatest portion of the budget during the past years; fees are determined by the parents' ability to pay.

THE PUBLIC is invited to visit Penrickton Nursery Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. The staff will meet with organizations and present a pictorial presentation of the program.

The U.S. Public Health Service (USPHS) was the leading contributor, giving \$1,000,928 to 29 research and medical training projects.

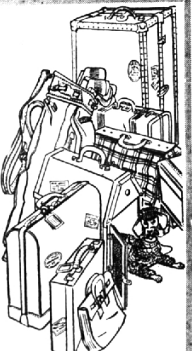

Four Area Men Named Chairmen Of Dental Review

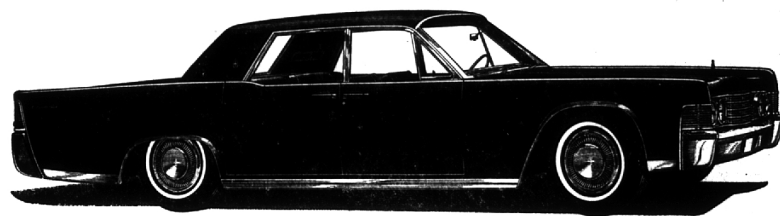

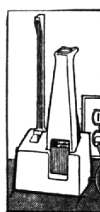
