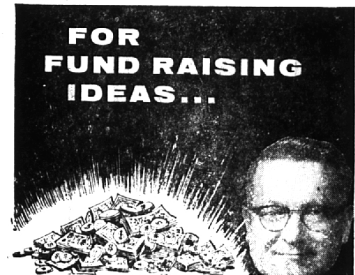
Bridal Pair Makes Home In Colorado
